



CFC has a deep knowledge of skills available and can help you source one fixer or put together a large pre-production and production team with a smile.

























































































### **Filming Permit**

Before starting to film your project, a "general filming permit" is required, a permit that allows you to officially process your various requests through all administrations you need to contact (customs, public locations, police...).

#### **VISA**

As a tourist friendly country, Visas can be obtained on arrival at the airport and extended hassle free in Cambodia. Foreign crews can have newcomers arrive onset every day without any additional paperwork.
